## President's Column – June 25, 2012

As I get ready to take over the presidency of **Sage** for the next twelve months, I can't help feeling optimistic and excited about the future of this organization.

Sage has recently embarked on a planning process that involves working with Todd Babiuk and Shawn Ohler of Story Engine to clearly define, in the context of our past, what Sage is now and where it wants to be in the future. Sage is very much a service-oriented organization providing unique programs like This Full House and Seniors Safe House. At the same time, it is a seniors' centre that welcomes all seniors in the area to participate in many fine programs. We actively seek ways to provide both services and programs that allow seniors to reach their full potential and contribute to their community. This could be by pursuing an interest such as singing, by developing computer skills or acting talents, or by participating in other classes that enhance their physical, mental, and/or emotional health. Or they could simply find human warmth and understanding from our exceptional staff and volunteers as well as from each other.

A few years ago when **Sage** learned that seniors within the gay, lesbian, bi-sexual, transgendered and questioning (GLBTQ) community didn't have a safe place to hold regular meetings, Sage reached out to the Pride Centre and offered such a place within our facility. The Over the Rainbow group has been meeting at Sage on a regular basis since then. This year, on June 14, the group hosted a Strawberry Tea for all seniors wishing to attend. Mayor Mandel, Michael Phair, M.L.A. Laurie Blakeman, and Councillors Ben Henderson, Don Iverson and Kerry Diotte were among the dignitaries present. Music, dancing, and delicious strawberry shortcake made the event fun for everyone. Perhaps the most significant part of the afternoon was the placing of the rainbow decal by Mayor Mandel on the front door of **Sage** signifying we welcome members of the GLBTQ community to our organization.

The recent victories of the GLBTQ community, namely the restoration of funding for transsexual surgery, the removal from legislation of

homosexuality as a mental illness, and the participation by such high profile political figures as the Alberta Premier in PRIDE week activities have taught us that with increased awareness, education, and interaction come understanding and acceptance. With these qualities come the hope that all Albertans enjoy equal dignity, respect and basic human rights.

As Sage moves forward, we will continue to seek ways to better reflect the diverse society we serve. We will do this by encouraging not only more GLBTQ participants but also more multicultural people in our activities, programs and leadership. We will invite all age groups to interact with seniors in an effort to stave off ageism. We hope to show those who view people in the last third of their life, as a liability or burden that we are, in fact, the opposite. The vibrancy, wellness, life experience, and boundless enthusiasm of the baby boomers entering this stage of life is a resource that can only add to the creativity, dedication to service, and quiet guidance of those already deep-rooted in this stage. Sage and other organizations like it, will tap this resource. With the assistance of various levels of government and other funders, we will ensure that the full potential of seniors is realized in making the Greater Edmonton Area a better place for everyone. Serving as Sage's President as we embark on this exciting journey is truly an exciting and life-enriching adventure for me.







#### **HOME SERVICES:**

When Ken called Home Services requesting help with snow removal for his Mom, he was just one of over 740 snow removal requests that were fulfilled last year. Ken, who lives in B.C., wanted to ensure his mother would have services in place to clear snow. His 75 year old mother attempts to do the shovelling herself; but Ken is concerned with the physical toll and the heightened risk of falling. Ken was delighted to learn that there was a Snow Busters group in his mom's neighborhood. Not only will his mom receive affordable snow removal; but, the service will be provided by someone who lives right in her community.

The Sage Snow Busters Program enables community leagues or groups to raise funds by providing snow removal for seniors. The high demand for snow removal continues to exceed resources available. Home Services is currently enlisting community leagues and other groups to participate in The Snow Busters program. If you would like a Snow Busters group in your neighborhood, encourage your Community League or other community groups to contact the


